The City of Knoxville Tree Board was first developed over 30 years ago in an effort to help create a better tree canopy in Knoxville. It is made up of 11 volunteers that live in both the city and in Knox county. The individuals on the tree board range from green industry professionals, students, retirees, and people that are passionate about the tree canopy in Knoxville. The purpose of the tree board is to:

- Educate the public on trees and the urban canopy
- Develop legislation to protect and expand the urban forest
- Host an annual Arbor Day celebration
- Attend monthly meetings at the Public Works building
