## **Curbside Recycling**

- All recyclable items should be placed loose (NOT in plastic bags) in your curbside cart or drop-off center dumpsters. Plastic bags and plastic film ruin curbside recycling; never place them in your curbside cart.
- Do not put glass in your curbside recycling cart; glass is only accepted at the five City of Knoxville Recycling Drop-off Centers (see locations below)

## **GLASS BOTTLES AND JARS**

# STYROFOAM EGG CARTONS AND MEAT AND PRODUCE TRAYS

Take to any area Publix grocery store, three locations in Knoxville. Please **remove the plastic wrap and the absorbent liner**. Cartons and trays must be clean and dry. Packing and other large Styrofoam is not accepted.

#### PLASTIC BAGS AND PLASTIC FILM

Using reusable grocery bags is much more sustainable than recycling plastic bags. Bread, tortilla, and other unavoidable plastic bags can be deposited at many local grocery stores (e.g., Kroger, Food City, Walmart, Publix, etc.). Markets for these low-grade plastics fluctuate but generally remain low; contact stores directly for information about whether bags are being recycled at this time.

## **FOOD SCRAPS**

Food scraps in landfills waste valuable space and create methane, a powerful greenhouse gas. The Knoxville Compost Pilot Project composts your food scraps to help grow nutrient-rich food at local farms.

- 1. Visit <u>knoxvilletn.gov/compost</u> to learn all about the project.
- 2. Take the Approved Food Scraps quiz and get the combination to unlock the collection bins.
- 3. Collect ONLY the following food scraps:
  - fruits
  - uncooked vegetables
  - egg shells
  - coffee grounds
  - paper coffee filters
  - nutshells
- 4. Drop your approved food scraps in a green collection bin at the Old City Recycling Drop-off Center, 227 Willow Ave.
