Corey Hodge graduated as salutatorian at Austin East High School and completed his education at the University of Tennessee. He uses his creativity to craft stories, receiving national acclaim. In his two books, *As the Sun Smiles* and *A Simple War: The Tale of the Best Worst Hero*, Corey draws on experiences in his hometown (one character lives in East Knoxville and another attends "Falcon High School"), allowing local readers to recognize and better connect with the story. His writing provides inspiration to young people in Knoxville while simultaneously showing them they are not alone in their struggle against obstacles.

Beyond writing, Corey encourages young people in his job as a primary school teacher at Maynard Elementary School. He mentors youth through Project Grad and provides his "Legends of Knoxville" scholarship annually to a few deserving individuals.

Corey strives for excellence in all his endeavors - writing novels, teaching students, playing drums - while proving to the younger generation that people are only bound by the limits they place on themselves. Corey's students showed surprise when he told him about his published books. He said, "Being an author is something that a lot of students don't realize that they're capable of becoming. So, going back to the communities, showing them other options, showing them other capabilities, other potentials that their work, that their intelligences are able to help them become." Corey aims to help young people dream without limits and work to make their dreams a reality.


