Red Cross Ready For Adults:

Be Red Cross Ready is a national, standardized preparedness education program for adults taught by a certified presenter. The curriculum is designed to help people understand, prepare for, and respond appropriately to year-round disasters like home fires and local hazards like tornadoes.

Rating Ready For Adults:

This 30-minute presentation introduces our free membership program to help businesses, schools, or organizations become better prepared for disasters and other emergencies. All in one place, Ready Rating members have access to one-of-a-kind tools, resources and information for evaluating and improving their ability to withstand disaster, maintain operations, and protect lives and property.

Hands-Only CPR For Adults:

In this 30-minute program, participants learn how to check for consciousness, call 911 (or the local emergency number), and give continuous chest compressions. Having more citizen bystanders trained in this simple skill can help save lives by putting more cardiac arrest victims within a few steps of lifesaving assistance. CPR training certification is not provided through this course.

KUB offers presentations on Energy Conservation and other company-wide initiatives and projects that affect customers. KUB's topics include:

Can the Grease (preventing sewage backups in homes/neighborhoods caused by cooking grease)

Century II (proactive infrastructure management and replacement program for all services)

Construction Projects (electric, natural gas, and water system upgrades)
Energy and Water Conservation (tips to conserve energy and save on utility bills)
Green Power (reducing our region's dependency on non-renewable resources like coal and other fossil fuels)

PACE 10 Wastewater Collection System Improvement (construction projects, wastewater facilities, environmental impact, etc.)

Private Sewer Lateral Program (maintaining proper connections to sewer mains to protect your property and the environment)

Natural Gas Safety and Call 811/Utility Damage Prevention (what to do if you suspect a natural gas leak and information about calling 811 to have utilities marked before digging)
