SUBJECT: Quarterly Administrative Revie Concerns (4th Quarter 2017)	w of Agency Practices Including Citizen

As required by CALEA Standards and KPD General Order 1.41, the Internal Affairs Unit conducted a quarterly review of bias based profiling issues for the fourth quarter of 2017. After the review of relevant data and reports, there is no indication that any officer in this department is involved in bias based profiling.

During the fourth quarter of 2017, the Internal Affairs Unit received one racial profiling complaint. The Internal Affairs Unit will continue to review and aggressively follow-up on any citizen complaints of this nature.

Clarence Vaughn of the Police Advisory and Review Committee was contacted regarding citizen complaints that involved bias based profiling. A copy of PARC's 4th Quarter report showed one incident of racial profiling involving the Knoxville Police Department.

A review of the 2017 Recruit Academy curriculum confirmed that all officers are still receiving extensive training regarding bias based profiling and diversity issues to include legal aspects, as required by departmental policy. The curriculum for the current and any upcoming Recruit Academy will be reviewed to ensure this practice remains in place.

Additionally, the following included data was reviewed and there were some increases and decreases from the previous quarter.

Arrests decreased between the 3rd quarter of 2017 and the 4th quarter of 2017 (2833 to 2582), the number of suspects also decreased (from 7536 to 7124).

- State Seizures and DAGs —this report showed an increase in the total number of seizures from the 3rd quarter of 2017 to the 4th quarter of 2017. In the 3rd quarter of 2017 there was a total of 28 seizures. In 4th quarter of 2017 there was a total of 33 seizures (132 seizures total for 2017).
- Citations-The number of citations for the 3rd quarter of 2017, when compared to the 4th quarter of 2017 show an decrease in the number of citations issued (from 4863 to 4576).
- Field Interviews-When the 3rd quarter of 2017 is compared to the 4th quarter of 2017, there was an increase in the number of Field Interviews (2328 to 2424).

Racial Profiling Report 4th Quarter

(October 1st – December 31st)

There was two alleged racial profiling PARC case reviewed by the Committee during the 4th Quarter.

Case #1 Summary:

The complainant came to the PARC Office to discuss an incident that occurred on September 28, 2017. While on the campus of the University of Tennessee, the individual was approached by UT Police Officers. The complainant stated that the officers yelled "Hey Boy, put your hands behind your back", in which he was detained. Also, the complainant stated that he was detained for approximately 3 hours before being informed that he was under arrest. The complainant was arrested for theft of a stolen bicycle. The police officers transported the complainant to Knox County Jail, in which he was held for a total of 4 days. The complainant stated that he felt profiled and harassed due to being an African-American Male.

Conclusion:

After further review, the complaint occurred outside of PARC's jurisdiction and was referred to the University of Tennessee Police Department for further investigation. The complainant was informed and his information was shared with the University of Tennessee, Chief of Police office.

Case #2 Summary:

The PARC office received a phone call from a complainant in reference to her boyfriend being allegedly harassed and profiled by a Knoxville Police Department officer. The individual was stopped and charged with a DUI after allegedly passing the field sobriety test administered by the officer. There was some conflicting information shared by the officer, per the complainant. The complainant alleges that her boyfriend was profiled due to being an African American male. We were informed that the vehicle involved in the incident was impounded and held until further notice.

Conclusion:

The Executive Director made several attempts to contact the complainant, in which he has not received a return call. The case is currently pending further review.

Racial Profiling Complaint for the 4th Quarter of 2017.

Case #1 Summary:

The complainant filled out a Referral Action Form regarding an incident that occurred on 09/21/2017 and returned it to the Internal Affairs Office on 11/06/2017. The type of complaint listed on the referral was harassment and racial profiling. The complainant advised that he was walking to his residence, when officers jumped out of their cruiser, pulled their guns on him and searched him. When the complainant asked what was wrong, the officers advised they mistook the glass case for a gun. According to complainant, the officers then threaten him with a jay walking citation and was rude during the interaction. The complainant never mentioned race or racial profiling in his description of the event (complaint).

Findings:

The disposition of complaint was **Unfounded**-(Alleged complaint did not occur). The investigation revealed that the officers acted within the scope of their duties and their actions were lawful and proper.



4TH QUARTER 2017 CITES - COMPARISION BY AGE Percentages Rounded to Nearest Whole Number




4TH QUARTER 2017 CITES - GENDER / AGE






4TH QUARTER 2017 CITES COMPARISION BY RACE Percentages Rounded to Nearest Whole Number
